operation. Things are going well – bit of a long haul having my foot elevated the whole time – but we're getting there. Thank you so much to all of you wishing me well

There are lots of exciting new developments at the Club I'd like to mention. For starters we have begun a Monday morning duplicate 10.00 - 13.00. under the leadership of the wonderful Martin Jones. What better way to start the week! We now have seven daytime duplicates, the four weekday afternoon ones all playing 24 boards. For the Tuesday and Thursday evening players. I am newly renaming the Trophy, previously known unimaginatively as the Tuesday-Thursday Cup, as the Stocken Cup - in honour of Peter and his three sons Jack, Simon and Zebedee all of whom have contributed so much to the success of the Club since its beginning back in 1995. We will be celebrating Peter's 1000th Hand Analyses on Thursday evening April 29th - do come and play that night. Also, by popular demand, we have reinstated the Annual Teams Day, to be held on Saturday 8th May 11.00 - 16.00. Make early plans and recruit your dream team of four.

I have devised another full package of courses for you this summer (we count April as summer here, perhaps a tad optimistically). I am personally looking forward to a return to teaching (with the

Gold Cup Success




David, Alexander and Andrew win the Gold Cup for the third time in six years

As I parked my bike to look at pelicans and seals in San Diego's Pacific Ocean, I reflected that in the space of the next seven days I had to play the Final of the US Reisinger, take the dreaded redeye back, hop off the plane to teach my last week of classes at ARBC, then rush up to Scotland to play the semi-final and (hopefully) final of the Gold Cup, Britain's big annual knock-out tournament. All that plus a trip to hospital (X Rays, Cat scans etc ahead of foot op.) plus spending time with my family (we had seen precious little of each other lately).

Hardly ideal preparation (isn't travelling West to East so much harder than East to West – something to do with our circadian rhythms). All went smoothly – made the Reisinger Final and finished 4th (best British finish and an above expectation achievement amidst all the world's best); easy flight back – a row of three seats and some kip; delightful classes at No. 31 – of course; and I was soon in Peebles ready for action

The semifinal pitted us against five wily campaigners, including regular ARBC player Victor Silverstone. None of us could claim to be on our "A game", my big "chuck" being to let the opponents make Two Clubs redoubled (ooh dear I shudder even now to think what a defensive absurdity I perpetrated). However we prevailed by a small margin, my favourite deal being one where partner Alex (who runs our Wiltshire offshoot with Suzy Lewis) and I bid and made Four Hearts plus one whilst in the other room the contract was – well there was no contract. The deal was passed out.

On to the final – after a sleepless night trying vainly to adjust to UK time – which saw us opposing three of my teammates in the World Junior Championship-winning side exactly 20 years previously. 64 deals were played in both rooms – but Deal Two was perhaps the most crucial of the lot. Here it is:

- [11] I could count 12 tricks six spades and three ace-kings. I followed the motto "where there's 12 (tricks) there's 13", hoping partner held a queen or a doubleton club.

West led a passive trump vs Seven Spades, normal against a grand slam on the grounds that it gives little away. After winning and drawing trumps, your leader faced a choice between cashing ♣ AK on the off-chance the queen would drop (as it would here), then (if not) playing ♠ A and a diamond to dummy's jack (the best chance for three diamond tricks). Or, alternatively, running lots of trumps and forcing the opponents to discard: perhaps a squeezending would develop, perhaps I would get a read on the opposing hands to tell me to play diamonds differently, or perhaps the opponents would simply discard erroneously.

I took the latter option, the downside being that I would have to discard clubs from dummy, removing the option of dropping a short ♣ Q.

When I threw a club from dummy on the fourth trump, I had theoretically gone down in a grand slam with 13 tricks easily available (if I just played clubs from the top, dummy's ♣ J would be a third-round winner). I threw another club on the fifth trump, then played ◆AK and ruffed a diamond. Nothing good happened there, but mercifully West had by this point discarded three clubs, so when (after ♥AK) I led ♣ AK and tabled ♣ 5 at Trick 13, it was the only club left. Phew − 13 tricks and grand slam made.

The opposing North-South pair at the other

table – the Tredinnick twins – settled safely in Six Spades so we gained a large swing – and also unsettled East-West who had let the grand slam make after I had selected the wrong line (arguably right in theory, though, I think).

62 deals later and we were holding the Gold Cup aloft (it was never easy and our final margin of 22 imps reflected a tight battle). That was about the only time you get to hold the cup though – insured for forty thousand pounds, it really is a gold cup.

It was the fourth time in eight years that David and I (either as partners or teammates) have won the Cup and the third for Alex. Our fourth and fifth members were Tony Forrester, Bridge maestro and Daily Telegraph columnist plus Peter Crouch, with whom I shared a house back in the Eighties (and who used to pass me at 7 am as I was returning from all-night bridge games and he was setting off to his more conventional accountancy job – but that's another story...).

Getting to ARBC.

How easy is it to get to the Bridge Club?... Very easy here's how.

1. Our favourite way - walking - or like Andrew and many of his team - why not cycle?

We actively encourage all our members to either walk or cycle into the Club. There is cycle parking located to the side of the Club, and also by the entrance to Parsons Green Underground Station.

2. Public Transport - another fine option and easier than you may think.

Tube – Parsons Green Station is less than a minute's walk from the club. The station is on the Wimbledon branch of the District Line and trains run every 10 minutes.

Bus – The No 14 stops on the Fulham Road, near the top of Parsons Green Lane. The service links Putney Heath to Tottenham Court Road Station. Daytime frequency is every 6-8 minutes and night time frequency is every 12 minutes. The 414 also goes down the Fulham Road up to Edgware Road. The No 22 stops on the New Kings Road, near the bottom of Parsons Green Lane. The service links Putney Common to Piccadilly Circus. Daytime frequency is every 7-10 minutes and night time frequency is every 12 minutes.


3. Taxis/mini-cabs

The Club loves members using local taxi and mini-cabs rather than their cars. If you would like to book a cab, there are several numbers of local firms displayed on the notice board in reception; alternatively ask a member of staff.

4. Private Cars

We would like to discourage you from driving to the Club. The local residents are understandably very concerned about increasing the number of cars in an already congested area. In particular, please avoid parking on the Residents Bays that double up as Pay and Display in the streets between the Club and the Fulham Road. If you must drive, please try car-sharing. The Bridge Club has 12 of its own spaces in the yard just next to the Club (clearly marked).

- After 5pm you can park free on yellow lines in the side streets and on Resident Bays.
- After 6.30 pm you can park on the yellow line, on the far side of the Parsons Green Lane, from the chip shop opposite the club up to the Fulham Road.
- The remaining yellow lines on Parsons Green Lane are off-limit until 8pm.

How (not) to be Dummy_

One quarter of the time at Bridge you are dummy. Phew - a chance for a breather! In France, the dummy is often called "Le Mort" and that is a good summary. You can disappear to the bar/kitchen and make tea / gin + tonic. Much of the time you will remain at the table to lend moral support, but it is important that your support is of the morale variety and not more...

What Dummy should do...

- After the opening lead is played, the dummy lays their hand face up on the table in four columns, one for each suit, with the column of the trump suit (if there is one) on the right as they look at the table. It is the declarer who is responsible for deciding which cards to play from their hand (as well as from their own hand).
- Dummy is allowed to prevent declarer from infringing the rules but otherwise must not interfere with the play. For example, they may attempt to prevent declarer from leading

from the wrong hand (by stating, e.g., "you won the last trick in dummy") but must not comment on opponents' actions or make suggestions as to play.

• In casual bridge games dummy will often do nothing, but in duplicate bridge dummy must play cards from their hand at declarer's instruction e.g., after declarer says "jack of hearts please, partner".

In short you do not do much. Enjoy the break.

What Dummy should NOT do...

- Tap the table to remind declarer they are in dummy (unless declarer is clearly about to play from hand).
- Play a card before one has been called.
- Play a different card to the one called.
- Question the card called.
- Offer to 'run the clubs'.
- Point to a suit on the table.

These things may not affect the outcome but they lead to confusion about who is playing the hand, and create ill feeling at the table.
