# When to Bid a Suit Slam - "FAST"

Small slams occur about one deal in 15: surprisingly common. Only if you're worried about the number of Aces should you use Blackwood 4NT, or its modern version Roman Key Card Blackwood (RKCB). Think of Blackwood as a way of avoiding slam, not reaching slam. Mostly you can bid a slam **FAST**, without Ace-asking...

#### F for Fit

Look for nine - even ten - trumps and you can make slam with many fewer than the 33 points for 6NT.

#### A for Aces

The partnership need all the aces or all but one. If you might be missing two, use Blackwood (or RKCB).

## **S** for Shortages

Voids (especially) and singletons are hugely powerful when you have a big fit.

#### T for Two-loser suits

Be cautious when you have a suit with two (or more) quick losers. Even if you have all the other aces and kings, your slam will fail if the opponents can cash an ace-king.

#### Examples:

You open 1 and partner bids 3 . With which of these hands should you go for slam?

(A). No. Just one ace, a two-loser heart suit, and no shortage.

Settle for 4.

(B). No. Poor shape (5332), and a two-loser club suit. Bid  $4 \spadesuit$ 

(C). Yes. Excellent shape (5431), no two-loser suit, and a singleton. Bid  $6 \spadesuit$ .

# Will Smith learns Bridge at ARBC \_\_\_\_



A few months ago comedian, actor and writer Will Smith came to the Club and attended a few of my Beginner Classes in order to get the hang of the game. Here is the resulting article he wrote in Intelligent Life...



After months of lessons, Will Smith is delighted to learn that he is a "natural" at bridge. "It is a milestone in my life to be declared a natural at a sport. Any sport", he gloats. Here are ten of his discoveries ...

I Am, Apparently, a Natural Player I was told this by Andrew Robson, bridge correspondent and former world champion. It is a milestone in my life to be declared a natural at a sport. Any sport. Which bridge is, having been recognised as such in 1997 by the International Olympic Committee.

It's More Complicated Than It Seems Like cricket, the basic rules are easy to grasp. Bridge: win tricks with suit's highest card. Cricket: stop ball hitting sticks. Also like cricket, bridge has myriad rules and obfuscating terms. Such as "undertricking", which sounds like a magician cutting short his act at a children's party.

Don't Try to Explain the Rules to Your Wife When You've Had Only One Lesson There is nothing more humiliating for an apparently natural player than having your statements questioned, and being forced to check the facts on Wikipedia. Actually, there is. Discovering she was right.

**Telepaths Only Need Apply** The element of mind-reading involved in silently agreeing a trump during the bidding stage makes picking

your partner a delicate process. In one beginners' game I played, it might have helped if mine had known the difference between clubs and spades. They also suggested it would be easier if more colours were introduced to the pack. This is the sort of person you should follow to see how they manage to open doors.


At Some Point Someone Will Make a Very Bad British Film About Bridge I predict it will tell the tale of a working-class British player who shakes up the bridge establishment with his uncouth, rock'n'roll ways. The story will climax at the World Championships, where some crusty old traditionalist will try to sabotage our hero's chance of winning because he doesn't want to see the game popularised and full of riff-raff. But our hero wins the game, the audience and the heart of a random girl. Etiquette is Important When your partner puts down their hand, you have to say "Thank you, partner" and then they wish you good luck. This slipped my mind once, when I was more concerned with seeing what cards my partner had. The other players were family friends--yet I still felt as if I had broken wind while kneeling to receive a knighthood.

You Will Think About It When You're Trying to Sleep I am a past master at reliving events and fantasising about different outcomes. But it's normally with things that matter, like whose black-gloved hand picks up the ring at the end of "Flash Gordon". Not whether I'd have won the rubber if I hadn't bid hearts with a king, when it was glaringly obvious that my opponent had the ace. After hours of sleepless deliberation, I can say with some certainty that the respective answers are: "Dale Arden", and "Probably not".

# Being a Good Partner\_\_\_\_\_





"I have always believed that your attitude toward your partner is as important as your technical skill at the game."

Rixi Markus, English Lady International

Although the late Rixi Markus was never known for her gentleness at the Bridge table, she is quite right. One of the great joys of Bridge is the partnership element. Be a good partner and your diary will soon fill up! Plus you will get the best out of your partner, both in terms of their enjoyment and their performance.

Here are eight of the most important guidelines for being a good partner, with the last being the most important of all.

- Always thank partner for their dummy, even if it is a disappointment and/or you do not agree with their bidding.
- 2. **Never criticise partner** remember they are trying their hardest.
- 3. **Always encourage.** Congratulate them on a well played hand; commiserate them on a failed enterprise ("Hard Luck" will make them feel better, even if luck didn't really come into it!).

- 4. **Keep a straight face.** Apart from being unethical to convey information facially, it is also undermining.
- 5. Try to picture things from partner's side of the table anticipate their problems and seek to make things clearer.
- 6. Never side with an opponent against your partner. If you do not agree with partner, say nothing.
- 7. Always thank partner at the end of the game (even if things didn't go well).

And finally...

8. Have a good time, and make sure that your partner does also. "Bridge is for fun. You should play the game for no other reason. You should not play Bridge to make money, to show how smart you are, or show how stupid your partner is...or to prove any of the several hundred other things Bridge players are so often trying to prove." US Bridge legend Charles Goren.

Bridge is by far the greatest game man has devised. If you derive a tenth of the pleasure from it that I have, it will be – if not a lifechanging experience – then a hugely lifeenhancing one.

# Getting to ARBC \_\_\_\_\_

## How easy is it to get to the Bridge Club?... Very easy here's how.

#### 1. Our favourite way - walking - or like Andrew and many of his team - why not cycle?

We actively encourage all our members to either walk or cycle into the Club. There is cycle parking located to the side of the Club, and also by the entrance to Parsons Green Underground Station.

#### 2. Public Transport - another fine option and easier than you may think.

Tube – Parsons Green Station is less than a minute's walk from the club. The station is on the Wimbledon branch of the District Line and trains run every 10 minutes.

Bus – The No 14 stops on the Fulham Road, near the top of Parsons Green Lane. The service links Putney Heath to Tottenham Court Road Station. Daytime frequency is every 6-8 minutes and night time frequency is every 12 minutes. The 414 also goes down the Fulham Road up to Edgware Road. The No 22 stops on the New Kings Road, near the bottom of Parsons Green Lane. The service links Putney Common to Piccadilly Circus. Daytime frequency is every 7-10 minutes and night time frequency is every 12 minutes.


#### 3. Taxis/mini-cabs

The Club loves members using local taxi and mini-cabs rather than their cars. If you would like to book a cab, there are several numbers of local firms displayed on the notice board in reception; alternatively ask a member of staff.

#### 4. Private Cars

We would like to discourage you from driving to the Club. The local residents are understandably very concerned about increasing the number of cars in an already congested area. In particular, please avoid parking on the Residents Bays that double up as Pay and Display in the streets between the Club and the Fulham Road. If you must drive, please try car-sharing. The Bridge Club has 12 of its own spaces in the yard just next to the Club (clearly marked).

- After 5pm you can park free on yellow lines in the side streets and on Resident Bays.
- After 6.30 pm you can park on the yellow line, on the far side of the Parsons Green Lane, from the chip shop opposite the club up to the Fulham Road.
- The remaining yellow lines on Parsons Green Lane are off-limit until 8pm.

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# **On Kibitzing**



Extract from John's (wonderful – AR) book "Tales from the Bridge Table" (p83)

Many years ago, John Crawford, a top American player in the pre-war era, was declared in the seven spades on the deal across:

Crawford always a lively, charismatic figure was surrounded, as often happened, by an array of spectators. West had led the club queen and Crawford won in dummy. He was about to lay down his trumps and claim his contract, when he noticed that the kibitzers were not moving and were sitting on the edge of their chairs.

Surely, Crawford reasoned, if trumps were able to divide normally there could be no problem. So why, he went on to ask himself, had the spectators not all moved away? Why were they staying? Crawford thought about it, and the only conclusion was that he would have to finesse the top of spades, a line that gains only if



East holds all the outstanding trumps. Craused his judgement, table presence and in to take just that line. The kibitzers had held him. He finessed the ten. East indeed held four outstanding spades and was predicta amused to find the contract being made the way.
